Congratulations on finishing Kindergarten! Just like practicing a sport or musical instrument helps you stay strong and improve, practicing math and language arts helps to keep your skills sharp and build new ones.

Your summer work grade will be the total number of “May Do” and “Must Do” points earned for a total of 100 Points.

- **“May Do”** - There are several options you “May Do” to earn points while you practice this summer. With your parents, choose one or more “May Do” options to earn up to the points listed, and make a plan to finish the work independently.
- **“Must Do”** - The “Must Do” is an assessment.

Must Do Requirement = 40 Points Possible	
<p>Test on Summer Required Work: The first week of school, all students will take an assessment on the curriculum completed over the summer. The test grade will be worth 20 points.</p> <p>All students entering First grade must complete the Summer Reading Log provided at the end of Kindergarten. New students will need to pick up a Summer Reading Log from the office.</p>	
May Do = 60 Points	
<p>IXL- (For returning students only.) Make sure you are logged into your <u>school IXL account</u> to get credit. Students can complete a total of 8 hours (Less than 20 minutes per day) practicing the kindergarten skills under the “recommendations” tab on IXL over summer break. All work is time-stamped within the program, and teachers will verify that the required hours were completed during the summer.</p>	60 Points

Click here Spectrum Summer Bridge K-1 (teacher recommendation) Each page includes a short mini-lesson, and QR codes are available for optional video support. Complete all workbook problems <u>except for the vertical addition, vertical subtraction, fact families, and missing addends</u> (or parts) in the workbook, which are not covered in Kindergarten, and are not required. Students may complete them as a “challenge”. They will not be tested on these skills on their beginning-of-the-year assessment.
